Some Thoughts on Tonight's Debate:

Do we remember the first time these two met on a debate stage? Not a pretty picture, mostly due to unhinged behaviour on the part of one participant. Tonight tens of millions will watch the Biden/Trump debate but no live audience and mics will be muted when necessary, thank goodness!

Is it fair to say we don't have any idea what to expect tonight but we hope for civility, integrity, strength, wisdom, and much more than competence? With ongoing war in Ukraine and Israel, and an aggressive China on the rise, the American election in November may be the most important election in decades. Why should Canadians care about what happens in America? Beyond vital trade considerations I believe we need a strong American neighbour, the world needs a strong America. Nature abhors a vacuum and a weakened U.S.A., politically, societally, creates a power vacuum eagerly filled by less democratically-inclined global players. May all of our American neighbours and friends find tonight's political discussion to be enriching, informative and inspirational. In Jesus' name. Amen.
