Words to Contemplate in Advent

"I am absolutely amazed that Joseph is the first person in the New Testament who learned how to read the Bible. Like Joseph, we are to read it through the spectacles of the grace and the goodness and the love of God. The Bible is to be read in the light of the character of God. As my old friend down on the other side of the mountain in East Tennessee used to say over and over again, 'Well, Craddock, I know one thing. God is just as good a Christian as we are.' That's not bad; that's not bad at all...

"Christmas for me has already started because I know that when Jesus is born, the man who will teach him, raise him, care for him, show him how to be a carpenter, take him to the synagogue, teach him his Bible, and teach him his lessons is a good man and he will do right. When you have somebody like that, it is already Christmas, and Christmas will last as long as God can find in every community one person who says, 'I will do what is right.'

"What is right is to read the scripture and to read the human condition in the light of the love and grace and kindness of God. As long as there is one in every community, it will be Christmas. The question, of course, is whether or not you will be that person."

It's traditional that the wider community of faith participates in sharing the Christmas story at our Candlelight Service Dec. 24th.



 - * January 4th, 10 a.m.: Second Sunday after Christmas.


